

INFORMATION ON THE PROCESSING OF PERSONAL DATA RELATED TO THE COMPLETION OF THE "NEWSLETTER" FORM

This notice supplements the website's browsing policy and aims to explain how the Data Controller will specifically process the data entered in this form: you are therefore invited to read the [information notice relating to website navigation](#).

Identity and contact details of the Data Controller

Fondazione Venezia Servizi alla Persona, hereinafter also referred to as "Fondazione Venezia" or "Data Controller", with registered office in Venezia Mestre (VE), via Rampa Cavalcavia n. 9, can be contacted at the email address info@fondazioneveneziaservizi.it, certified email (PEC) pec@pec.fondazioneveneziaservizi.it, or phone number +39 0413039211.

Purposes and legal bases

A. Newsletter: Fondazione Venezia has activated a newsletter service through which it processes collected personal data to send emails containing promotions, event invitations, information about organized exhibitions, greeting messages, and similar communications.

B. Management of consent and withdrawal: The Data Controller processes personal data to confirm that subscription to the newsletter service occurs following a verified expression of consent (double opt-in). The Data Controller records unsubscribes from the newsletter service to avoid sending further communications to those who do not wish to receive them (*unsubscribe list*).

C. Legal defense purposes: The Data Controller may need to process personal data to manage disputes and out-of-court or judicial litigation.

Purpose	Legal basis (common data)
A.	Content.
B.	Legitimate interest of the Data Controller in collecting validly expressed consent and keeping track of withdrawals to avoid unwanted contact.
C.	Legitimate interest of the Data Controller to establish, exercise, or defend a legal claim.

Retention period

Purpose	Retention time
A.	After unsubscribing, data will no longer be processed for newsletter delivery.
B.	30 days from data registration; data stored in the blacklist are kept for 5 years
C.	10 years from the final resolution of the dispute.

Nature of provision and consequences of refusal

Purpose	Nature	Consequences
A.	Optional	Inability to receive the newsletter.
B.	Optional	Inability to receive the newsletter.
C.	Necessary	Inability to manage the dispute.

Scope of communication

Data are processed by authorized internal staff for specific tasks and are communicated externally according to the following rules:

Purpose	Categories of external recipients
A.	Companies providing hosting/services for technological platforms.
B.	Companies providing hosting/services for technological platforms.

C. Law firms; judicial/administrative authorities.

Since data are also processed using IT tools, they may also be visible to entities providing maintenance/support services for such systems.

Transfer of data to a third country or international organization

The Data Controller transfers personal data to countries and under the conditions summarized below:

Purpose	Country	Lawfulness condition
A.		Personal data will generally not be transferred to non-European third countries or international organizations.
B.		However, the Data Controller uses certain IT services that may involve transferring data outside the European Economic Area. This will take place in compliance with specific safeguards provided by applicable data protection laws (destination countries have privacy laws deemed adequate by the European Commission; companies within the same group are bound by approved binding corporate rules; entities based in the United States adhere to an agreement with the European Commission ensuring adequate protection; entities not meeting these conditions have signed standard contractual clauses approved by the European Commission).

Data subject rights

The data subject is entitled to the following rights:

Access: to know whether personal data are being processed and, if so, to access them and obtain a copy

Rectification: to request updates, correction of inaccurate data, and completion of incomplete data

Erasure: to request deletion of personal data under certain conditions (for information contact the Data Controller).

Restriction: to request limitation of processing under certain conditions (for information contact the Data Controller).

Objection: to object to processing based on legitimate interest or public interest tasks

Portability: to receive personal data in a structured format and transmit them to another controller where applicable

Withdrawal of consent: to withdraw consent without affecting the lawfulness of prior processing
